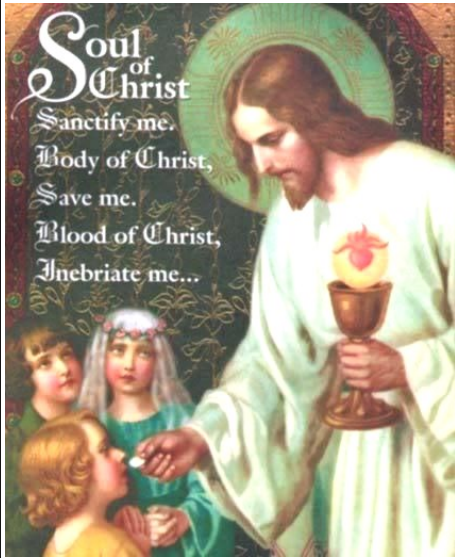

CLOCK RESTORATION: Next year marks the 150th anniversary of the installation of the clock and bell in the tower.

The clock face is severely weathered, the clock was last renovated in the late 1980's. The company who service the clock and bell have given me us cost for the work - taking it away and refinishing it properly to last for many years. It is a highly specialized job, and if not done properly, the paint will not last. However, with the scaffolding that would be needed, the cost would be around £20,000. Given that, we thought it would not be possible to go ahead but one of our parishioners is kindly pursuing a grant from a charity that supports civic projects; and there may be other help available. If anyone has any other ways of accessing funds, please do let us know!

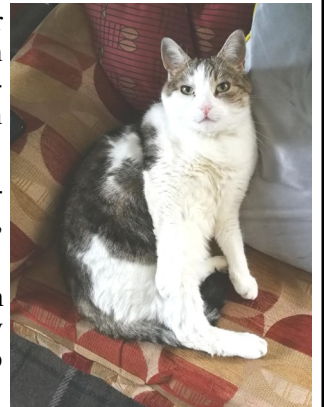

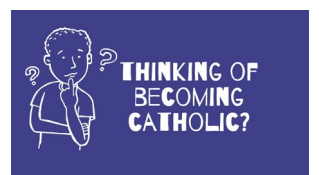
Act of Spiritual Communion. My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Spiritual communion is a practice that allows us to connect with God and express our longing for His presence, especially during times when we cannot attend Mass or receive the Eucharist. Many saints have emphasized the importance of this prayer, as it fosters a deep spiritual relationship with Christ & helps maintain one's faith and devotion.

EASTER OFFERINGS: Thank you for your Easter Offerings; the collection taken up at the Easter Masses. Traditionally, this collection is specifically aimed at the upkeep of clergy in each parish. It no longer goes to the priest personally but helps to cover the general stipend and costs of having a priest in residence.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION:

Those in Catholic Schools are now signed up for Confirmations this year. If you are not in a Catholic school but wish to be Confirmed, please speak to Fr Simon as soon as possible.

Conformations for 80 young people with Archbishop John for our Family of Parishes will take place here at St Mary's on Tuesday 2nd June at 7pm.

Divine Mercy Sunday takes place each year throughout the worldwide Church on the second Sunday of Eastertide and was formally approved by Saint John Paul II.

The devotion service will be held at **Sacred Heart, Chorley 12 April starting at 3.00pm** with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

Private Confessions will be available during Exposition. The afternoon also includes the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, the Rosary and the Sunday Mass of the day. The devotions end with the blessing of the Divine Mercy image and its veneration. All are very welcome to attend



PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO ROME 2027.

Exact dates to be confirmed when we know if there is enough interest to make it viable.

MEETING ON WEDNESDAY 15th APRIL in the Social Centre at 7.30pm.



Pilgrimage next year 2027 in Rome in the late summer/ Autumn (probably late September). Staying in a 3* hotel in the heart of the *Centro Storico*, the ancient heart of Rome, giving a fascinating glimpse into *La Bella Roma!* Please note that this involves walking the daily through the “Centro Storico” (historical centre) of the Eternal City, an area which is marked by cobbled streets, which requires anyone with mobility issues to think carefully about their ability to take part.

The cost is difficult to be precise at this distance (eg not possible to look up flights this far in advance) and dependent on deciding to include full or half board, which is best decided at the meeting, as to what the majority prefer. However, we are trying to bring it in for under

£1,000 per person based on 5 nights.

The price (based on sharing twin rooms) includes the hotel accommodation.

Flights and transfers at either end.

Guided tours each day.

Breakfast each day.

Please note that the price does NOT include Insurance or the cost of baggage on the flights each way (as this will vary from person to person, depending on what luggage you want to take).

A non-returnable deposit of £150 per person will be taken at the time of booking the flights.

We will visit some of the major basilicas, including St Peter's and a visit to the “Scavi” the ancient cemetery beneath St Pater's where his remains are buried. Also taking in many churches of historical and spiritual interest, housing great works of art by the likes of Caravaggio, as well as making note of little details bringing the centuries past to life.

Presuming the Holy Father is in Rome at the time, we will also attend a Papal Audience.

The great sights such as the Forum, the Trevi Fountain and the Coliseum will also be on our routes. Time for shopping and opportunity to visit the Vatican Museum (which is the only way to see the Sistine Chapel) will also be included. Eating in the outdoor cafes and restaurants, soaking up Rome's unique ambience, are an essential part of experiencing the city.

Daily Mass will form part of the schedule.



PILGRIM HOLIDAY TOP FRANCE. 13th—20th AUGUST 2026. 7 nights in Saint Pierre de Maillé in France.

An historic area in the heart of France, exploring history and Catholicism, staying in the Villa St Pierre, next to the River Gartempe. Following the meeting we had, there are about 20 people interested in going.

Cost to be around £700 per person. Younger children at a discount, travelling at £300 each.

Including transport, flights and most meals (with wine for the meals) and en-suite accommodation, entrance costs to attractions & daily Mass.

Outward: Departing Manchester Airport Thursday 13th August.

Return: from Limoges Airport 20th August.
