The Octavius Singers will give us a splendid introduction to Christmas with Carols, popular Christmas songs, Classics and Readings. It is a concert rather than a service to enable you to invite along people of all faiths and none. It was lovely last year and this year promises to be even better, with great effort going into it's preparation. The Octavius Singers give their time and talent for free and usually perform religious works, particularly in their original religious context. For example, singing settings of the Mass during the celebration of Catholic Mass or Evensong in Anglican churches.

Performed under the auspices of the Order of St Lazarus, raising funds for charity. In recent years the Order has supported a variety of causes, including those affected by Hanson's disease (leprosy) in Sri Lanka. They do this through a local charity (SUROL) with it's patron, the Archbishop of Colombo, Cardinal Malcolm Ranjith. SUROL stands for the "Society for the Upliftment and Rehabilitation of Leprosy Affected Persons" and was founded in 1971 by Fr. Realino Chiriatti. SUROL's purpose is mainly to rehabilitate those affected and disabled by leprosy, help their return to communities and rebuild their lives with dignity and self-respect. The founding members adopted a non-religious, non-sectarian and non-partisan strategy for the Society which opened doors for everyone. Public education to remove the stigma attached to leprosy was one arm of SUROL's two-way plan, the other being the important task of rehabilitation of disabled leprosy affected persons.

There is no charge for entry or the reception afterwards but a collection will be taken up in church. We are blessed that we have raised many thousands of pounds for this charity over the years.



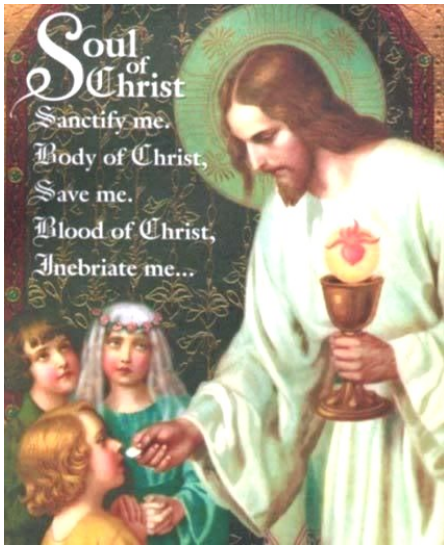

FIRST CONFESSION & HOLY COMMUNIONS.

Our First Communion preparation has begun, with forty or so children taking part. The next session is in the Social Centre on **Wednesday 7th January at 6.30pm.**

Children must sign the “Golden Book” at the back of church.

This is to make a record of their prayers and attendance at Mass for each Sunday until their First Communion as a gift for Jesus. It will be carried up to the altar on the day of their First Communion.

Please note that attendance at Mass & the preparation sessions are a prerequisite of being able to make First Communions in Eastertide of next year. If families are not able to make this commitment, then those children can defer and join the program next time round.

ST PATRICK’S NIGHT CÉILIDH Saturday 21st March 2026.

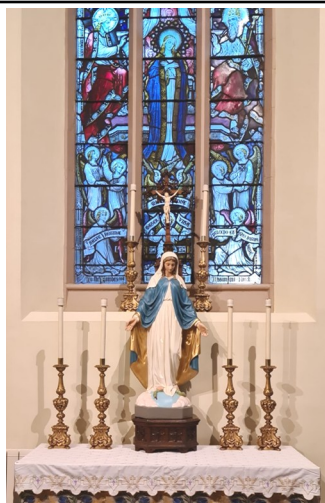
A traditional Irish celebration with Irish Stew and live music to dance to. Suitable for all the family. Again, further details to follow.

MISSIO: Red Boxes for the Missions: Our Missio Rep will be handing out Missio brown envelopes to red box holders for you to place the money into them from the red boxes. Please don’t leave your Boxes in church /sacristy but empty them into one of these envelopes or your own bag with your contact information on it. Some people who only acquired them recently may not have enough to bring the money in this time but others will. This same process will happen twice a year. Thanks again to all who give to Missio in this way, which is the Holy Father’s charity for World Mission. We now have 41 Missioners signed up. Fantastic effort!



SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION: This great feast of Our Blessed Lady falls on Monday. Our church is closely connected to it: Below the window depicting the Assumption & Crowning is our statue, which portrays Her in connection to this Dogma. The defining symbol of this Devotion is Mary standing on the globe, crushing the Serpent underfoot—representing the triumph over Original Sin, the Serpent as a representation of Satan.

When, by the application of Christ’s triumph over death and sin applied to Her in advance, as it were, she was conceived in her mother, Anna’s womb in the usual way with her husband Joakim, it was done without Her inheriting Original Sin—thus, Immaculate Conception. It is this Original Sin that is washed away in our baptism. But, alas, unlike Our Lady, we all fall into sin again in the course of our lives. It is celebrated as Solemnity (though not a Holyday of Obligation in this country). Perhaps you might come to Mass on Monday, or at least visit her altar in church today to light a candle there to ask for any special grace.

BAMBINELLI SUNDAY: The tradition of families bring their “baby Jesus” figure from their Cribs at home to be blest in church has long been a part of life in some European countries. Pope St John Paul II took it up as a practice at the Vatican and it has since become popular in many other places around the world. It takes place next week on Gaudete Sunday and we will join in with this tradition as a way of bringing prayer and a sign of the Faith into our homes. When he first blest figures at St Peter’s, Pope St John Paul said this to the children:

Take home, with great care, the little statue of the Infant Jesus, also as a sign of God’s love for you and your families. Put it in your Crib with intense faith, with that faith wherewith the Blessed Virgin, the Mother of God, laid the new-born Jesus in the manger. Invite your father, your mother, your brothers and sisters, the whole of your family, to gather round the Crib and pray there together with your family.

So next Sunday, do bring in the figure of Jesus to church to be blest at Mass. Children (and anyone else too!) can bring them forward for the blessing but children can also receive a little Bambino for their own personal devotion and bring these up to be blest. Perhaps they can set them up at home as a reminder of the focus of Christmas amid all our practical preparations.

JOIN OUR PARISH 100 CLUB

For many years St Catherine’s Church has run a 100 Club to assist with parish funds. It seems sensible to keep this going under our new circumstances.

There are, in fact, several free numbers for new people to be able to join. In fact, if we can get enough people to sign up, it could be extended in scope to become larger.
